Rock the Parkway Runners Fill Kansas City Streets to Support Children's Mercy Kansas City

KANSAS CITY, Missouri — Five thousand runners took advantage of Saturday's nice weather to participate in the 15th annual <u>Burns & McDonnell Rock the Parkway</u> halfmarathon and 5K. In partnership with <u>KC Running Company</u>, the race started and finished along Kansas City's scenic Ward Parkway and benefits <u>Children's Mercy Kansas City</u>, which provides healthcare, programs and resources to improve the lives of children and their families.


In 2023, Rock the Parkway raised \$47,000 in donations to help bring hope and healing to children like Beau Burkett who was diagnosed with hydrocephalus — a brain condition — and other health-related issues as an infant.
